

2026 Inter-Mountain Jr. Livestock Sale Contract

It is a privilege to sell an animal at the Inter – Mountain Jr. Livestock Sale, therefore the following is a list which must be met in order to sell.

- 1) You are undertaking a 60-to-120-day commitment to your animal project.
- 2) Each Exhibitor is allowed a max of 2 tamper proof ear tags assigned by the Inter-Mountain Fair. A picture of your market animal(s) with ear tags in their ear must accompany your sale contract as further proof of ownership. Families or groups sharing backup animals must list ear tag numbers on the bottom of signature page. If an Ear tag comes out, it must be brought to the fair office to get a replacement and recorded.
- 3) Exhibitors that have been enrolled in 4-H, FFA or GRANGE cannot change to Independent after Jan 1, 2026.
- 4) 4-H / FFA Members must complete the requirements of their club/chapter for the year as set forth by their organization. Independent Exhibitors must complete the requirements set forth by the Inter-Mountain Fair.
- 5) You must feed and care for your project animal yourself, prior to and through the completion of the sale. The individual must solely own animals. Feeding times and consequences are spelled out in the Inter-Mountain Fair rules.
- 6) You must participate in a livestock event of your project species prior to the Inter-Mountain Fair. All first-year projects and all Beef exhibitors must attend a hands-on livestock event. All Beef Exhibitors must show their market animal at a hands-on event. You must contact your 4-H Leader/FFA Chapter Advisor / IMF management and make arrangements to participate in a designated livestock event. Documentation proving participation in livestock events must be made available to your 4-H Leader/FFA Chapter Advisor / IMF management.
- 7) You must accompany your animal at weigh-in and Beef Exhibitors must lead their own animal on to scale, unless previous arrangements have been made with your leader/advisor/IMF Management, prior to the start of weigh-in. The fair manager must also be aware of these arrangements.
- 8) You must attend the fair to show and sell your own animal at the discretion of fair management.
- 9) During a hands-on event or weigh-ins, if an animal is determined to be unmanageable, or could be a public safety hazard, a written warning will be given to exhibitors. The warning will be signed by the exhibitor, a leader, Fair Management, and the exhibitor's parent / guardian. If that animal is not manageable by weigh-ins or 9 am Thursday of the Inter-Mountain Fair, the animal will need to be removed from the fairgrounds and will no longer be eligible to show or sell. The Fair Management makes this decision final.
- 10) You must write a thank you note to your buyer(s) before you receive your sale check. Checks must be cashed within 90 days of issue or will be void.
- 11) All pictures will be taken on show day. You are responsible for getting your animal to the picture area and getting your picture taken.
- 12) Any exceptions must be cleared with your 4-H Leader / FFA Chapter Advisor / IMF Management. Decisions by the Inter-Mountain Fair Manager are final.
- 13) All State, Local and Jr. Livestock rules shall be adhered to.
- 14) The Jr. Livestock Sale is a terminal sale.
- 15) Fair entry forms must be complete and in the fair office no later than 5:00 PM, Friday, August 7, 2026. Quality Assurance certificate must accompany your entry form. Incomplete entry forms or missing certificates will not be accepted. Leader's may come into the office after due date to sign forms.

All hogs will be tattooed Sunday evening for the sale Monday.

All Lambs must have Scrapie tags, any lambs without tags will not be allowed on the fairgrounds.
