LOCAL RULES

Please Read all Rules, Regulations and Guidelines Carefully!

ENTRY INFORMATION

1. All State & Local Rules apply to all entries at IMF. State Rule Booklets are available for viewing in the Inter-Mountain Fair Office and online at www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe.
2. **Entry paperwork closing date and entry fees for All Animals, and Stills Exhibits (excluding Agriculture/Horticulture, & Floriculture) are due in the fair office by 5:00 pm on Friday, August 7, 2026. Agriculture/ Horticulture & Floriculture entry paperwork is due in the fair office by 5:00 pm on Friday, August 14, 2026. No late entries will be accepted.**
3. Entry fees must be included with entry form. *See exhibit handbook for applicable fees.* Fees varies for each class/division. Entry fees are non-refundable.
4. *Please see exhibit schedules for submission of entries due dates and times.*
5. Entry form must bear the exhibitor's signature. Exhibitors signature on the entry form signifies their acceptance of the rules and regulations governing the IMF as printed. **4-H Note:** *The Farm Advisor Signature requirement for "out -of county" entries has been waived. Project or Community Leader signature will be required on all 4-H entry forms*
6. All entries in the still exhibits must have been made/collected/grown/prepared within 1 year of the opening date of the fair, except otherwise noted in the exhibit handbook.
7. Premium checks must be cashed/deposited within 90 days of issuance. Checks will be voided after 90 days. Voided checks will not be reissued.
8. **EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY:**
 - a. **Senior Divisions:** Open to the world
 - b. **Junior Divisions:** Limited to residents of Shasta, Lassen, Plumas, Modoc, Tehama, Trinity, & Siskiyou counties (excluding market animals).
 - c. **Junior Market Animals and Master Showmanship:** Limited to juniors residing in the Fall River and Big Valley School Districts. One market animal per exhibitor. *Please see Junior Livestock Sale Contract for additional rules and information.*
9. **JUDGING:** All classes will be judged on the AMERICAN SYSTEM except when the Danish System is specified at the class/division in the exhibitor handbook.
10. **ADEQUATE COMPETITION:** Fair Management has the right to limit entries, return entries, transfer entries or combine divisions/classes, and/or cancel any division/class in which, in its judgment, the entries are insufficient to secure adequate competition. Any return or entries under this rule must be done generally and without discrimination.
11. **REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS:** **No exhibit shall be removed from the fair prior to 3:00 pm on Monday, September 7, 2026 with only the following exceptions:** 4-H Rabbits, and 4-H Poultry, (all released after the judging of their class) and sifted animals (must be removed by Sunday of fair by 8:00 am).
12. **Exhibitors of Market animals are responsible for their animal until 3 pm. Leave Water in Pen!**
13. Fair staff and management reserve the right to reject or remove any entries found offensive or distasteful.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Checks can be made payable to Inter-Mountain Fair or IMF.
2. If the Bank refuses the check, a penalty of \$35.00 per check must be paid prior to the judging of the entries. If the check is returned after the judging, any/all premiums won will be withheld until the fees and penalty are paid. Only cash, certified check, or money orders are acceptable for a payment following a returned check.
3. **All Premiums awarded to Exhibitors and all Jr. Sale checks must be cashed within 90 days of date of issue or may be void. Thank you letters to Jr. Livestock buyers must be completed before receiving Jr. Livestock Sale check(s).** There will be a \$30.00 fee for Stop Payment, if a replacement check is issued. Premiums are paid only in accordance with the results recorded on judge's sheets. Tags, ribbons, etc., have no value as to payment of awards.
4. **No dogs, with the exception of service dogs, that are properly identified/with paperwork, are allowed on the fairgrounds. This applies to all fair attendees.**

5. All Animal Exhibitors, Commercial Exhibitors, Concessionaires, Fair Campers and public will be able to purchase Fair passes when submitting entry forms and contracts. **Market Animal Entry Fees include one weekly admission pass. Passes are \$20. Daily Admission is \$7. Admission passes are available until the opening of fair on Thursday, September 3, 2026.**
6. All livestock and other entries are shown at the owner's risk and management shall not be responsible for loss or damage by fire, theft or otherwise. Management shall provide watchmen during the fair.
7. USDA Canning Rules, and the Score Cards for judging, as prescribed by the Division of Fairs and Exposition, apply to all entries at the IMF.
8. The Inter-Mountain Fair will not allow gang clothing or clothing affiliated with a gang, which promotes, intimidates, or influences actions that will disrupt the fair policy of promoting a family atmosphere thus interfering with the business within the fairgrounds.
9. IMF Management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret all local rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regards thereto, and also reserves the right to amend and add to the local rules. State Rule interpretation is solely at the discretion of the California Department of Food and Agriculture, Division of Fairs & Expositions. The IMF will enforce state rules as written.

Junior Department Rules

Limited to Juniors located in Shasta, Siskiyou, Modoc, Lassen, Plumas, Tehama, and Trinity Counties, except as noted at class headings. State Rules and Health Rules applicable to the Senior Department apply also to the Junior Department.

ELIGIBILITY AND AGE REQUIREMENTS

1. For age requirement classes, the age of an individual shall be as of January 1, 2026.
2. 4-H Primary members may participate if they are at least 5 years but not over 8 years old by Jan. 1, 2026. Primary members receive ribbons only and no premiums.
3. All entries must have been made, collected, grown or prepared and entered by exhibitor enrolled in those 4-H Youth Program projects within one year of the opening date of the fair, unless otherwise noted.
4. All entries must have been made, collected or prepared by the exhibitor in accordance with the requirements or recommendations of that project program. Entries that require packaging and labeling, such as food preservation and entomology, must be done in accordance with directions and recipes in project manuals and outlines. Carefully check the recommendations for kind and size of container, and method of labeling. Only standard containers, specifically designed for the purpose will be accepted.

CAMPING POLICY

1. All Campers must pay admission to the Fair. Admission is NOT INCLUDED in the price of the camping spot.
2. East Lawn spaces by the animal barns are only available to LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS. Exception only to 4-H Club or FFA Chapter trailers and staff. If you had a lawn space last year but are not exhibiting any livestock this year, you will be moved to another available camping space.
3. Tents are allowed as long as they remain in your assigned 12-foot-wide space.
4. Trailers along the Beef Barn may not plug into the barn for power. You may bring a generator for your power supply.
5. A Camping space with access to a power pedestal DOES NOT GUARANTEE full use of trailer amenities (example A/C).
6. If your space is in overflow camping, you share a power pedestal. DO NOT plug into another spaces power or you may be removed from camping space.
7. Reservation and camping fees must be paid in full (with accompanying livestock entry forms for east lawn) by Friday, August 7, 2026. All unpaid spaces will be considered available and assigned to a new camper from the waiting list.
8. Management designates all camping spaces. Spaces are subject to change. Prior year campers may have priority. After previous campers have paid for their camp space and have met the requirements to camp, management will fill empty campsites with people from the waiting list. Waiting list rolls over from year to year. Spaces cannot be handed down from one person to another.
9. No Vehicles will be allowed to be "camped in" on the grounds. Vehicles not removed by 8 AM will be towed at owner's expense.
10. NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS! This applies to ALL FAIR ATTENDEES. The only exception is if the dog is entered in a show, which it is to be removed immediately following the conclusion of the show or service dogs that are properly identified or with paperwork.
11. All outside food and beverage brought in camping area with trailer must stay in camping area.
12. Adult supervision must be provided at all times in East Lawn Livestock camping area.
13. Campers must put trash in provided trash cans.

I have read these rules and acknowledge that any violation of these rules may result in fair management requesting me to vacate the premises, power being turned off to my pedestal (if applicable), or the surrender of my camping spot for the 2026 Inter-Mountain Fair. I acknowledge camping at the Inter-Mountain Fair is a privilege and not guaranteed regardless of prior year camping.

- *When entering the Fair, the honor system applies. Please be sure you have read and abided by these rules to the best of your ability.*
- *All entries in these divisions must be the work of the exhibitor unless otherwise noted, and must be completed within one year of the opening date of the Fair. Articles previously exhibited at the Inter-Mountain Fair are not eligible.*
- *An item eligible for entry should be entered in the most appropriate Division and class. Any exhibit not properly entered may be transferred to its proper class by Fair Management, whose decision may be changed only by the judge. Fair Management is NOT responsible for locating any entry errors.*
- *All entries will be judged in their entirety as a finished quilt. All quilts must have a hanging sleeve on the back with a 4-inch opening. Due to limited space, some quilts may not be shown in their entirety. Every effort will be made to show ribboned quilts to their best advantage.*
- *All entries must be quilts. Other textiles such as regular sewing and handcrafts have separate sections in the Fair Premium book. A quilt must be three layers: 2 layers of fabric separated by a layer of batting and held together by stitches.*
- *A kit is defined as a pattern plus fabric*

AMATEUR DIVISIONS:

- *Traditional quilts are separated by several identifying factors to ensure that quilts can be judged in peer groups.*
- *Quilting Styles- This main grouping of quilts is broken out into comparative quilting styles, as follows:*
 - *HAND QUILTED quilts may be pieced by machine but the quilting has been done entirely by hand. This would include hand-tied quilts. Hand quilts are not broken out by size, only by skill level.*
 - *MACHINE QUILTED BY MAKER are those quilts made entirely by one person, including all the machine top-stitching.*
 - *MACHINE QUILTED BY OTHER are those quilts whose top was made by the entrant but the top-stitching was done by someone else. This could be anyone using a machine to do the top-stitching, either amateur or professional.*
- *Skill Levels: Amateurs and Professionals are welcome to enter the Fair. A Professional is a person who engages in an activity or event as part of their livelihood or for profit. Entries may not be placed in both Amateur and Professional Divisions. Amateurs are further separated by skill level, as defined below. These definitions are strictly guidelines for quilters to consider when self-assessing for this show.*
 - *JUNIOR: Individual who is age 18 or less.*
 - *BEGINNER: Individual over age 18 who has not yet won any blue (first place) ribbons in quilting, in any quilt show.*
 - *INTERMEDIATE: Individual over age 18 who has earned at least one blue (first place) ribbon in any quilt show. It is up to the discretion of the entrant to determine at what point they should move their entries up to the Advanced skill level. This could vary depending on the skills used for a given quilt. In other words, the entrant might be highly skilled at piecing but this particular quilt might have been a learning experience in some other technique such as machine embroidery, in which case perhaps this quilt should not be entered in the Advanced skill group.*
 - *GROUP: Two or more quilters have worked to put the quilt together. The implication is that the skill levels of the participants could vary. There is no assumption as to whether the quilt was quilted by a member of the group or outsourced to someone that is not part of the group.*

- *ADVANCED: Any amateur over the age of 18 may compete at this level.*
- *Sizes- Quilts may be any size, but to encourage competition amongst quilts that are similar, we have added a breakout by size. Sizes are defined as follows:*
 - *SMALL is up to 240 inches in circumference.*
 - *MINIATURE quilts are more specifically defined as large scale quilts made in a miniature size consisting of traditional piecing and/or applique blocks; completed/repeated blocks are usually 3 to 4 inches and the overall quilt circumference is no larger than 96 inches. As a point of reference, that would be 24 inches square or smaller.*
 - *MEDIUM is 241 to 299 inches circumference.*
 - *LARGE is anything over 299 inches in circumference.*

It is this way because there is really no standard size for bed quilts. Just as a point of reference, a twin sized quilt might be 63 by 87, which totals to 300 inches in circumference. Wall hangings should be entered in the category they fit in by size.

- *Class is a final breakout, which also aims to promote competition in kind.*

OTHER AMATEUR DIVISIONS:

- *Art Quilts: Art quilts entered in Class 1 must be the entrant's own original design meant to be used as a work of art and is made entirely by the entrant. Art quilt kits may be entered in Class 2.*
- *Vintage Quilts: These are quilts that were completed a long time ago or that may have been found from an old source, and have been recently completed by the entrant. These quilts will be judged and will qualify for ribbons and premiums from first through third place, but do not qualify for Best of Show.*
- *Display-only quilts: Anyone is welcome to display quilts in the show without entering them for competition, as long as space permits. Judged quilts will take priority if space is limited. You must put your name and phone number on your quilt.*

Animal Exhibitor Rules

2026 Exhibitor Handbook

1. ANIMALS THAT ARE NOT ENTERED IN THE FAIR ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE FAIRGROUNDS.
2. All State, Animal Health Rules, as prescribed by the Division of Fairs and Exposition, apply to all entries at the IMF.
3. YOUTH QUALITY CARE ASSURANCE: Junior Exhibitors (except primary exhibitors) that enter Livestock into the 2026 IMF must have a youth quality assurance (YQCA) certificate. The certificate must accompany the entry form. Entries will not be accepted without YQCA certificate.
4. All Hogs entered into the fair must be Prop 12 certified with paperwork stating as such.
5. OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBIT: Exhibitors must be the Bonafide owner of all entries. In addition, livestock must be owned prior to the opening date of the fair for: a) 30 days for Jr. Dept. Small Animals and b) 120 days for Market Beef, c) 60 days for all other Junior Department exhibitors.
6. WEIGHING OF ANIMALS: All animals for which weights are required must be weighed on the Inter-Mountain Fair county-certified scales on Wednesday, September 2, 2026, from 1:00-7:00 pm for swine and sheep and 1:00-3:00 pm for beef.
 - A. Animals will be assigned to classes by management. If weight is disputed, the animal is immediately taken off of the scale, the scale is checked for balance and the animal is immediately re-weighed. Re-weigh weight is final weight. At no time can the animal leave the scale area. Jr. Market Animals will be divided by weight into classes.
 - B. All Lambs must be dry, shorn and have a fleece no longer than ¼ inch stretched fleece before entering scale. Wet Lambs will not be weighed. *Pre weighing of animals may only be done prior to 5:00 pm, Tuesday, September 1, 2026. Scales will be locked until weigh-in.*
7. ANIMAL CARE: Exhibitors must provide and bed their animals with shavings, pellets, or wood chips. Rubber mats may be used under shavings, pellets, or wood chips. No Straw is allowed.
 - A. Livestock exhibitors must keep pens and stalls clean and well bedded. Animals are to be cared for by 8:00 am and 7:00 pm daily.
 - B. Exhibitor must check in at 8:00 am and 7:00 pm daily with their respective leader, Independents will check in with an assigned adult. Leaders may set times in which caring for the animal can occur to make sure exhibitor is in the barn. Each Leader is responsible for their own exhibitors. Violation of this rule results in the first offence being a warning and Second offense results in exhibitor and animal removal from Jr. Livestock Sale.
 - C. East Gate will be open prior to 8:00 am for the purpose of bringing in feed and bedding.
8. HEALTH CHECK: Management reserves the right to dismiss any animal that has a health issue. Animal health decisions will be made in the best interest of the animal and for the other animals at the fair as determined by the Fair Management in consultation with the Fair veterinarian.
9. All sheep must have Scrapie tags or tattoos.
10. SHOWMANSHIP: Only animals owned, fitted, and shown by the exhibitor in the Junior Department Livestock Classes are eligible for showmanship classes. Sifted animals are eligible.
 - A. Entries in Showmanship must be made on original entry form at the time Livestock entries are made. Leader's Signature required. NOTE:
 - B. All exhibitors are required to wear the official show uniform of the organization they represent. Independent exhibitors must follow dress code as stated in the local rules.
11. Horse stalls are available and stall fees must accompany entries and will be assigned on first come basis. Stalls must be cleaned by occupant upon vacancy.
12. Fair Management reserves the right to revoke the privilege to sell at the Junior Livestock Auction.

EXHIBITOR ELIGIBILITY AND AGE REQUIREMENTS

1. For age requirement classes, the age of an individual shall be as of January 1, 2026.
2. 4-H Primary members may participate if they are at least 5 years but not over 8 years old by Jan. 1, 2026. A Primary member may not enroll in a large animal project, but they may enroll in a small animal project. Primary members receive ribbons only and no premiums. Upon conclusion of judging each species, primary exhibitors are allowed to participate in a discussion typesetting with the judge.
3. To sell a 4-H project animal at fair, the 4-H member must have enrolled in 4-H, in the appropriate 4-H project(s), and be **at least 9 years old by Jan. 1, 2026**. All other membership and project requirements must also be satisfied prior to selling a 4-H project animal.

Uniform for Livestock Showing

- 4-H members must have 4-H Hat and Green Collar or Tie
- FFA members must have FFA Jacket and FFA Scarf or Tie
- White Collared Shirt, tucked in
- White or Dark Blue Jeans – No skinny jeans and must not be faded or have holes
- Footwear should be cleaned and polished (no sandals)
- Boots must be on inside of jeans

INDEPENDENT JUNIOR EXHIBITOR: Those persons who are not FFA, 4-H or Grange project members may enter the Junior Livestock show provided they meet the following criteria:

1. The exhibitor must be at least 9 years and not older than 18 years of age as of January 1, 2026.
2. The exhibitor must not have been enrolled in an animal project with FFA, 4-H or Grange after January 1, 2026.
3. The exhibitor must be a resident of the Fall River or Big Valley School Districts to participate in the Jr. Livestock Sale.
4. The exhibitor must sign and turn in a Jr. Livestock Sales Contract by May 1, 2026 for steers and July 1, 2026 for hogs and lambs
5. The exhibitor must provide fair management with a completed Jr. Livestock Independent Exhibitor packet that can be obtain in the fair office.
6. The exhibitor must have Liability Insurance through a homeowner/ranch or with California Fair Service Authority (CFSA). CFSA Insurance can be purchased through the IMF. Pricing for large animals is \$35.00/event or per family.
7. The exhibitors must have “on ground” supervision by a responsible adult.
8. The exhibitor will be assigned an adult to check in with for animal care times and requirements.

- Boots must be worn on inside of jeans

INTER - MOUNTAIN JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

1. Sale will be held on Monday, September 7, 2026, beginning at 9:00am
2. The IMF sets the policy for the Jr. Livestock Sale and reserves the right to revoke privileges to sell at the Junior Livestock Sale for any reason.
3. Sale is limited to exhibitors residing in the Fall River and Big Valley School Districts at the end of the school year.
4. Eligibility to sell ends 12 months after separation from high school or when married.
5. No exhibitor may sell at this sale who has sold at another Junior Livestock Sale in the current calendar year except for state-wide shows.
6. **The Inter-Mountain Jr. Livestock Auction is a terminal sale. Once an animal has qualified for the Junior Livestock Auction, as determined by the judge, the animal cannot be removed from the sale program or the fairgrounds. All market ready animals, including champions, must sell.**
7. **All sales are final. Buyers shall make checks payable to the Inter-Mountain Fair.**
8. Each exhibitor will be allowed to enter one market animal.
9. Minimum weight for steers is 1,100 lbs.
10. Minimum weight on lambs is 110 lbs.
11. Minimum weight for hogs is 210 lbs.
12. Market animals may start arriving at the fairgrounds at 1:00 pm. Wednesday, September 2, 2026 and will be weighed off the trailer. This weight shall be the sale weight.
13. Sale Commission is 8%.
14. Exhibitors must show their own animal in the sale ring and wear the official uniform required by the IMF unless they have written permission from the Management.
15. Sifted Market Animals must be removed from the Fairgrounds by 8:00 am. Sunday, September 6, 2026.
16. No private treaty sales allowed.
17. **The Brand Inspection Slip or Bill of Sale issued at time of purchase must accompany the entry form for all Beef Animals. The State of California blue/yellow transportation form, fully filled out, must accompany the cattle to the Fairgrounds. It is to be delivered to the Beef Scale upon arrival. This form is required by the Brand Inspectors before the animal is weighed.**
18. The Jr. Sale Committee assumes no responsibility whatsoever and does not guarantee the sale of any animal nor guarantee any prices.
19. All animals will be sold in accordance with the order of sale as determined by the Management. In the event of an animal being donated to a charitable organization and is to be resold, such sale will be held at the conclusion of the sale order.
20. Exhibitors are responsible for drug residue, tissue damage from injectables, or any carcass damage resulting in being condemned at time of processing; the exhibitor will refund the total purchase price of the animal.
21. Any exhibitor found committing fraudulent acts to his/her exhibit: i.e. changing or removing ear tags; will be ineligible to sell at the Junior Livestock Auction and all future auctions.
22. Memorial fund animals will be sold following the regular sale animals.
23. All Jr. Exhibitors must participate in a livestock event of your project species within the 2026 Project Year in order to sell in the Inter-Mountain Jr. Livestock Sale.
24. All rules on the Junior Livestock Sales Contract will be adhered to.
25. Market Hogs will be tattooed Sunday evening. **While hogs are being tattooed no exhibitors will be allowed in hog barn. No Exceptions!**
26. Exhibitors are responsible for their market animal until that animal is loaded on the truck for processing.
